

How do I know if my car battery is dead?

If there's leaking battery acid, or there's a crack in the battery casing, it's dead or dying and you'll need to replace it. If it's just the corrosion on the terminals, as described above, you can try cleaning the terminals and removing the corrosion. This could once again allow the battery to deliver more power.

How do you know if a car battery is swollen?

Swollen battery case While you have the hood popped, inspect the battery's exterior casing. If you see any signs of swelling, cracking, or bulging, it means the battery is damaged and weakening, and it needs to be replaced as soon as possible.

How do I know if my car battery needs replacing?

Note: for this method to work, you must have a battery tester that can perform a battery capacity test, not just a battery voltage test. For more info on how to interpret, check these 12V battery voltage charts, UK. There's also another alternative, a similar solution to know if your car battery needs replaced. You can get a car battery monitor.

How do I know if my car battery is corroded?

Your car battery is visibly corroded. You might notice a fluffy, blue coating on the positive terminal or/and a clear film on your battery casing. The battery warning light illuminates on your dashboard. If this light illuminates while you are driving, you are likely to have a battery fault or failing alternator.

How do I know if my car battery is leaking?

Corrosion can interfere with electrical connections throughout your car. Your battery is leaking fluid. If you see liquid dripping from the battery, or pooling on the ground under the battery when you park your car, the battery may have a leak. You may also notice a stinky, "rotten egg smell" coming from the battery.

How do I know if my car battery is healthy?

A multimeter can help you check the battery's voltage; a healthy battery should read around 12.6 volts when the engine is off. If the voltage is below this range, it may indicate the battery needs charging or replacement. Many auto shops offer free battery testing services that can provide a detailed health report on your battery.

If your battery can't hold a 12.4 V charge, replace it. You can find a new battery guaranteed to fit your vehicle by visiting our website and entering your vehicle information in the top left-hand corner. You'll find more information about types of batteries here. If your battery can hold a charge, try to recharge it.
